### Attending each day and arriving on time!

Building positive habits early makes each stage of development easier. **Please make every attempt to have your child at school on time; this allows for an easier transition into the school day and reduces the number of interruptions for other students in the class who have arrived on time.**

### 2018 EQAO RESULTS

The Grade 3 and Grade 6 assessment is implemented annually through the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) in every publicly funded Ontario elementary school. The assessment is based on the Ontario Curriculum. It measures how well students have met the provincial expectations in reading, writing and mathematics. This year's assessment took place over a period of six days in May and June of 2018.

Below are the results of the assessment for the province, for Trillium Lakelands District School Board and for Leslie Frost Public School.

End of Junior Mathematics (English & French)	<b>42</b>	37	49

Based on our results, we have identified that math will continue to be an area of focus in all divisions. We look forward to continued success for our students!
